St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort (31-01-1673 to 28-04-1716)



(Founder of the Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel)

St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort was born on the 31st of January 1673 in a small village in Britanny in western France. The 17th Century France was passing through a grave crisis, economic as well as social added to this 95% of the population was illiterate. The French Revolution which was to come almost a century later was already brewing.

It was in this atmosphere, charged with tension that St.Louis de Montfort founded the Brothers to impart education to an illiterate France. Not many were willing to follow this stern austere and maverick saint. When he died on the 28th of April 1716, there were only five Brothers Montfortian institution were only a handful and limited to Western France, When the revolution broke out. There was anarchy until Napoleon came to rescue France and conquered almost the whole of Europe. In 1821, when the Brothers met, they were still only a handful and discouraged. They decided to launch out of France.

The Montfortian saga in India began when on the 11th of September 1903 three French Brothers landed in the French colony of Pondicherry.

There was still no Montfortian Institution in India. It was in the next year, 1904 that **first Montfortian Institution** was started at Tindivanam, now in Tamilnadu. This was a technical institution. It is still in existence and flourshing. It was not until the end of the First World War that the first English medium school **"Montfort School"** was started on the shevroy Hill in Yercaud.

From 1903 to 2023, Montfortian Institution grew in India from one to nearly 200+ and are now spread over almost all states and Union Territories, literally from Kashmir to Kanyakumari and from Mumbai to Mizoram.

Montfortian Institutions are spread over thirty countries, from Canada, Columbia and Peru to Fiji and the Tonga Island in the Pacific.

History of the School

The mission inspired through St. Montfort, added an amazing will of God to extend the vision of Brothers of St. Gabriel by planting a new institution in Theresapuram, Sriperumbudur, under the Province of Trichy, headed by the council of Rev. Bro. Mariannan, the then provincial superior. The happiest memory in the diary of Montfort is the year 2016, which writes about the delightful experience of the people of this Industrial hub, signing up their kids in Montfort school during the month of May. The confidence of Montfort gathered the initial trust of the people around to submit their dreams under the care of Brothers of St. Gabriel. The hard work and struggle to mount up our monument was made by Rev. Bro. Johnson, the project Director by which our Temple of Learning was open for co-education on 18th June 2016. Montfort School created its history by virtue of admitting 165 students on roll in the very first year of its inception for classes LKG to Grade V. Thus, incredible plan of God made Montfort school, theresapuram, as another new hand in service of this global educational mission.

The school got Affiliated to CBSE – New Delhi (Affiliation 1931064) and Recognized by the State Govt. of TamilNadu, also the Recognition (Reg:001-12-S-0060-0319) of Education department with Co-education. It's indeed our proud privilege in the history to record Rev.Dr.Bro.AntonySamy.Ph.D, our pioneer Principal, Montfort School, a fortunate master piece as well, for having been the architecture of our educational style. Abide by his lofty ideals and goals, the most beautiful

page of Montfort in 2016-17 is the initial appointment of 15 well qualified and experienced faculty and to add more beauty our systematic art of schooling raised up our strength to 365 in the year 2017-18. The school commenced to progress steadily with good infrastructure facilities and also feeding a quality education that conceived 484 students in the academic year 2018-19.

The showers of Blessings bequeathed a ceaseless care in enlarging our infrastructures year by year from 2016, promoting the updated facilities. The continued support for this colossal mechanism was handed over from Trichy province to the province of Bangaluru. Not just building got raised, even our trust among the people in the range of our school that admitted 1000+ colors into our classrooms during the Academic year 2023-24.

The uncertain situation, the Pandemic caused a barrier on the path of Schooling from March 2020. As like every problem has a solution for it, the technology paved way to connect teacher and the learner with a bond called network. Though each one of us were into different walls, Montfort was able to continue our joyful learning by finding inventive means of teaching. That kept up the strength up to 563 for the online academic year 2020-21. In fact, Montfort built over its Trust by earning the gratitude of all its staff members for sustaining them nevertheless the pandemic. Luckily the lockdowns provided space now and then to train up the students of class 9 and 10 in view of their public exam. Montfort takes pride in declaring the 100% result of its first and second batch of grade X with 492 as its highest score. It was the output of sacrifices of our teachers to find initiatives in connecting the students with their lessons. Montfort school is upgraded as Senior Secondary from the academic year 2023-24.

Montfort aids as a nerve in bridging the human society with our goals to create students as best as ever sketching the nation with the colours of human values. Montfortian student are sure to have 'fullness' in life and be a valuable citizen to the country, a faithful loving person to his family and friends, moreover a gratified human being, thereby released as the richest legacy of our palace as a gift to the world, to make this entire earth, a holy land! Admission and Withdrawals

Normally admissions are done only in L.K.G. The child should be 3+ years of age at the time of admission. Registration for admission are done during the month of January, the time of which will be notified on the school notice boards. Original birth certificate should be submitted at the time of registration.

To withdraw a child from the school, the parent should make a written application to the Principal. Transfer certificate will be issued only when all payment due to the school are cleared. ATTENDANCE

- 1. All the pupils should attend the class punctually in neat and tidy uniform. If by chance a pupil comes late, an entry has to be made in the page allotted for late attendance in the handbook and the signature of the Principal, or other persons authorised, to be obtained before entering the class.
- 2. No leave or absence will be granted except on written application of the parents, addressed to the Principal /H.M. in advance. Students with 100% attendance will be rewarded.
- 3. Students who for unexplained reason absent themselves for more than five days continuously will have their names struck off the rolls and as a rule will not be re-admitted.
- 4. If a students is absent through illness, the Principal must be informed at once and the student must produce a medical certificate when he/she comes to school.
- 5. No students should be seen outside the classroom or out of the school during class hours.

Decency, Decorum and Conduct

- 1. Pupils will keep the class rooms and school premises absolutely clean, thus promoting a clean environment.
- 2. Damage to school property, disfiguring of walls, indecent language or behavior are serious offences which may entail punishment and even dismissal.
- 3. Pupils will at all times show respect and reverence to school authorities and members of the staff. They should remember that every child of this institution is a gentleman or lady in the making.
- 4. Resorting to unfair means in the examinations and tests is a grace offence and may result in detention and expulsion from School.
- 5. Any students failing twice in the same class will not be allowed to continue in the school.
- 6. Pupils should be responsible for the safety of their property. They are advised not be bring any costly articles to the school.
- 7. A student must obtain prior written permission from the Principal, before joining any course which could clash with the school programmes.
- 8. Only English should be spoken in the school premises to acquire greater fluency in the use of language.
- 9. Collection of funds, giving gifts to anyone for any purpose must not be made without the permission of the Principal.
- 10. Pupils should not bring any magazine or periodicals to the school.
- 11. In all it must be noted that the school is keen on children maintaining a presentable Personality in dress, language and outlook. Every pupil is expected to keep the high tone of the school excelling in conduct, good manners and cleanliness.
- 12. Students are not permitted to bring cell phone to school. Violation of this will result in suspension from school.
- 13. Lunch is to be brought by all the students.
- 14. Students involved in serious indiscipline within the school or outside, tarnishing the name of the school will be suspended or removed from roll.

FOR PARENTS

- 1. Parents are expected to co-operate with the school by enforcing regularity, punctuality and discipline in the children any by taking sincere interest in their progress.
- 2. To see that their children prepare their lessons at home and devote at least one hour in the morning and two in the evening to study. Only if parents give their full co-operation, the school can help in the all-round development of the child.
- 3. Parents / Guardian are requested not to see the children or meet the teachers during class hours without prior permission of the Principal. They can meet on the dates given in this book.
- 4. Parents should check the diary everyday and take note of the homework given and see that the homework is done before the children are sent to school the next day.
- 5. Any communication (request / complaint) made by the parents should be addressed to the Principal.
- 6. Parents and Guardians are requested to see that their children come to school with their hair properly cut and combed, in neat school uniforms.
- 7. Parents should encourage their child to participate in the school activities.
- 8. Presence of the parents at the Parents Teachers meeting is compulsory. Primary School (LKG Grade 1) students' Parents must meet the class teacher once a month to know the progress of your child.
- 9. Parents should avoid planning social functions, outgoing and pilgrimages on school days.
- 10. Parents should remit the school fees and term fees on the days prescribed without delay.
- 11. A progress report showing the academic development of the children, with suggestion for improvement, will be sent after each test or examination. The report must be signed by the parent/guardian and returned to the school within three days of issue.

ORDINARY WAYS TO HELP YOUR CHILDREN LEARN EXTRAORDINARY

- 1. Review your children's text books so that you know what they are learning in school.
- 2. Reinforce what children are learning in school by having them to teach you their newly learned skills.
- 3. Praise their efforts-not just their accomplishments.
- 4. Stress positive values caring, loyalty, trust, honesty, respect and responsibility.
- 5. Use newspapers as 'family' text books : Use the World, National and Sports pages to discuss current events.
- 6. Make deal, limit TV watching then spend some of this time watching programmes with your child. Post question about, and discuss the shows you choose to watch.
- 7. Show that you are interested in your children's lives by asking about school, their teachers, friends and listening to what they tell you.
- 8. Give your child your undivided attention. Remember that you can't compensate for your absence with gift.
 - "Being there for your child all the time is the best gifts you can give him/her".
- 9. Engage in a physical activity as a family: bike-ride together and take after-dinner walks, several times a week.
- 10. Visit the school and get to know your children's teachers and Principal.
- 11. Know what is your children's school records. Ask for clarifications, voice concerns.
- 12. Plan your family activities that relate to your children's studies particularly not during their exam time.
- 13. You will make mistakes. Keep in mind that children too; forgive sometimes more than adults.

PRIVATE TUITIONS:

The engagements of private tutors may prove harmful to real progress and should not be done without the written permission of the Principal. Violations of this, will be viewed seriously.

The Central Board of Secondary Educations specifically states as a condition of employment the following:

No teacher or other person employed in the school shall engage directly or indirectly in any trade or business. In the case of remunerative work like private tuitions specific written sanction of the school authorities shall be obtained. Parents and teachers should make a special note of this.

EXAMINATIONS & PROMOTIONS:

Educations is a continuous course of study. In line with the CBSE Policy, the performance of the students may be reviewed throughout the year by conducting tests and examinations. Thus assessment will be a continuous process, and will not be confined to the term and examination alone.

If any student is found lacking the ability to cope with the workload of the succeeding class he or she may be allowed to repeat one more year in the same class. If a student, even after spending two years in one class, remains unfit to take up the next higher class, he or she will be removed from the rolls.

PROMOTION IN JUNIOR SCHOOL:

The students should have performed well in the averages of the five exam conducted throughout the year and the annual exam, and with due consideration of one's character and discipline. Promotions of the students who have absented themselves from the Annual Examination is based on the following criteria;

- a. The student should perform well in the averages.
- b. The HM and the teachers concerned are confident that the student will be able to cope with the next class.
- c. Leave on Medical certificate / Exemption should have been sanctioned by the Principal.
- d. While deciding the fitness of a student for the next class, apart from the academic performance, the personality development also will be taken into account.

EXAM SYSTEM:

The academic year will be conducted as single term and will comprise of three Periodic Assessment (PA) of 5 marks weightage each did Halfyearly / Annual exams of 80 marks weightage followed by Note book submission and sub enrichment activities of 5 marks respectively.

Students must secure a minimum 40% for each term.

SPECIAL NOTE

We (the parent and the ward) are fully aware of the following and shall abide by these.

If a student is involved in any malpractice in any exam, T.C. will be issued or the student will be detained in the same class.

If a student is continuously absent for more than 5 days, without prior permission, the name will be removed from the rolls and he /she cannot be re-admitted.
